Dear Parishioners,

Today we celebrate the beginning of the Church. How appropriate as we see steel starting to form the shape of our new Church. **This past week I received a very pleasant surprise, a \$10,000 check from Linganore United Methodist Church on Clemsonville Rd. to put toward our Building Campaign.** Our gratitude goes out to them.

I thought this would be a good time to bring you up to date on our Campaign. At present we have in gifts and fundraisers \$375,840.87. We have a total of \$3,936,643.05 in pledges from 708 families. Of this pledge amount, \$1,843,055.01 has been paid so far. That's the good news. However that leaves over 1000 families who have not yet stepped forward to participate. I think our new Church should be built from the efforts of everyone of the parish. Please prayerfully consider what your sacrificial gift should be in building your new Church.


