- Learn what St. Paul taught about the Sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation, Reconciliation, Holy Orders and Matrimony.

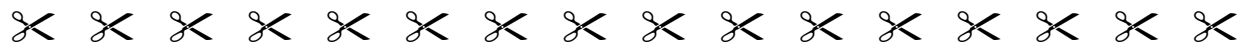
