First Reading: IS 63:16B-17, 19B; 64:2-7

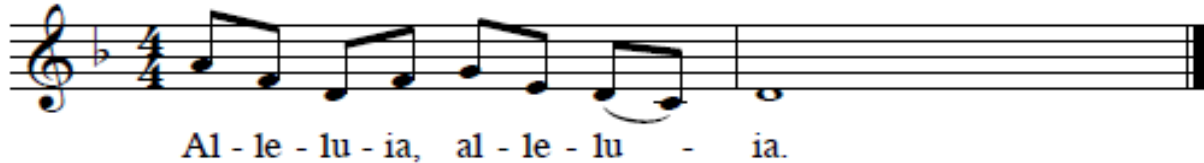
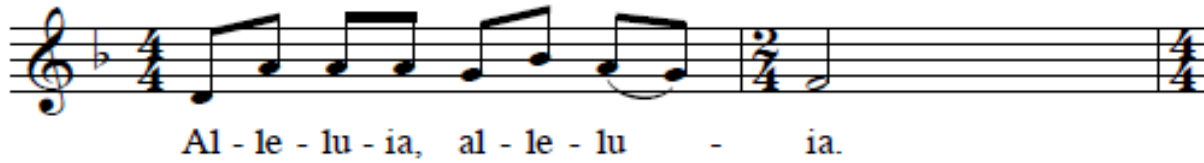
Second Reading: 1 COR 1:3-9

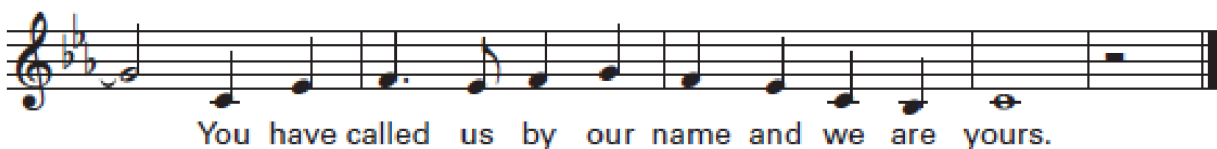
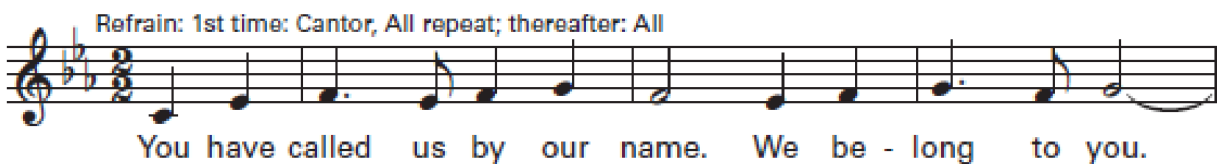
Gospel: MT 25:31-46

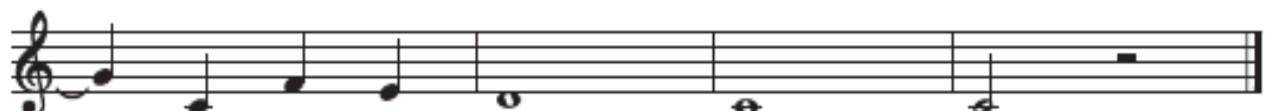
